Generally a committee composed of a minimum of three members (it should always be an odd number of members) and members that are well-versed in the operations of the organization. It is normally a lengthy process and should be done a minimum of every two years. That does not mean that changes have to be made, but to ensure timely changes are made, to reflect the operation of the organization

Greetings again Comrades.

As usual, July was a slow month. We only had one rental upstairs and received a couple of rental deposits. That is barely keeping us afloat.

In the Clubroom, we had the regular monthly donations from Ed Mowbray and John Ball sent us a very generous donation of \$525.00 for wherever we needed it.

We also received other small donations at the bar. Bar attendance has varied through the month. Some days we are very busy and other days, hardly anyone shows up. That could happen any day, Monday thru Friday. Friday night dinners in July weren't as well attended as in June, and of course, the Clubroom is just about empty by 10 or 11 pm.

In the Legion Account, renewals came in good the first couple of weeks but have slowed down now. We have had over 200 members pay their dues already and with the Honorary Life Members and Paid up For Life Members, we are well over 50%. We also have eight (8) new Members and four (4) Transfers. I have been helping Adjutant, Oliver Taylor, with the Transmittals and sending out the cards while he takes care of his wife. I have done it before and I have no problem with it. Both, taking care of my wife and doing Membership. We also had a \$100.00 donation from Gordon Talmage for the V.A. Hospital and \$65.00 from Grant Stephens for the General Fund. 
